All you could ever wish to know about the voting population in one easy-to-read table – IRR

Statement by Gareth van Onselen, Head of Politics and Governance at the IRR

The Institute of Race Relations today releases an 'IRR Voter Cheat Sheet' – a simple, three-page summary table that sets out every main voter position and characteristic from the IRR's February poll, ranked from 0%-100%.

Basically, everything you could ever wish to know about the voting population as of February 2019 is here, all in one easy-to-read table, ranked from the smallest percentage to the biggest.

Want to know what percentage of voters are favourable towards Julius Malema? Or which party most voters think the phrase "Cares about people of my race" best describes? And what about coalitions? Do Gauteng voters prefer an ANC/DA coalition or an ANC/EFF coalition? All this and much more is in our Cheat Sheet – over 100 statistics including key demographic data such as breakdowns by age, race, location, income and education.

The IRR will be releasing one final election poll a week before the election. Until then, we believe the information in our Cheat Sheet is the best, and easiest to understand, description of the voting population.
