



Do you think life five years from now will be better than, the same as or worse than today?







If a national election was held today, which party would you vote for?









How likely do you think it is that the ANC and the DA will remain together in the GNU until the next elections in 2029?

Reasons for not voting in the 2024 general elections











Since 1994, have relations between people of different races in South Africa improved, stayed the same or become worse?




Have you personally experienced any form of racism in the past five years?




Do the different races need each other for progress and should there be full opportunity for all?





What are the two issues you think should be the top priorities for the government?







- Due to the scale of political changes triggered by the 2024 elections, **the data indicate a** renewed if fragile hope that life can get better over the course of the 2024-2029 democratic term.
- The GNU has accumulated and maintained notable goodwill the foundation of an unprecedented opportunity to deliver popular, evidence-based policy reforms. This will unlock political support for GNU parties.
- Race relations remain positive and sound, ensuring the fertile ground necessary to establish a coherent and cohesive socio-economic national interest and unity.
- There is **significant aspirational overlap and belief in empowerment through economic growth** that allows for a common-ground, successful, and popular outcomes-based rather than ideological program of government for the GNU.



METHODOLOGY

Sample: N=604

Screening: Registered voters only

Margin of Error: 5%

Confidence Level: 95%

The poll was conducted telephonically, using a single frame, random digit-dialling sampling design. The sampling frame consists of every potential cell phone number in existence in South Africa, from which a probability sample is drawn. This approach ensures that every number stands an equal chance of being included in the study, which is the most basic condition that must be met for survey results to be generalizable to the population from which a sample is drawn.
